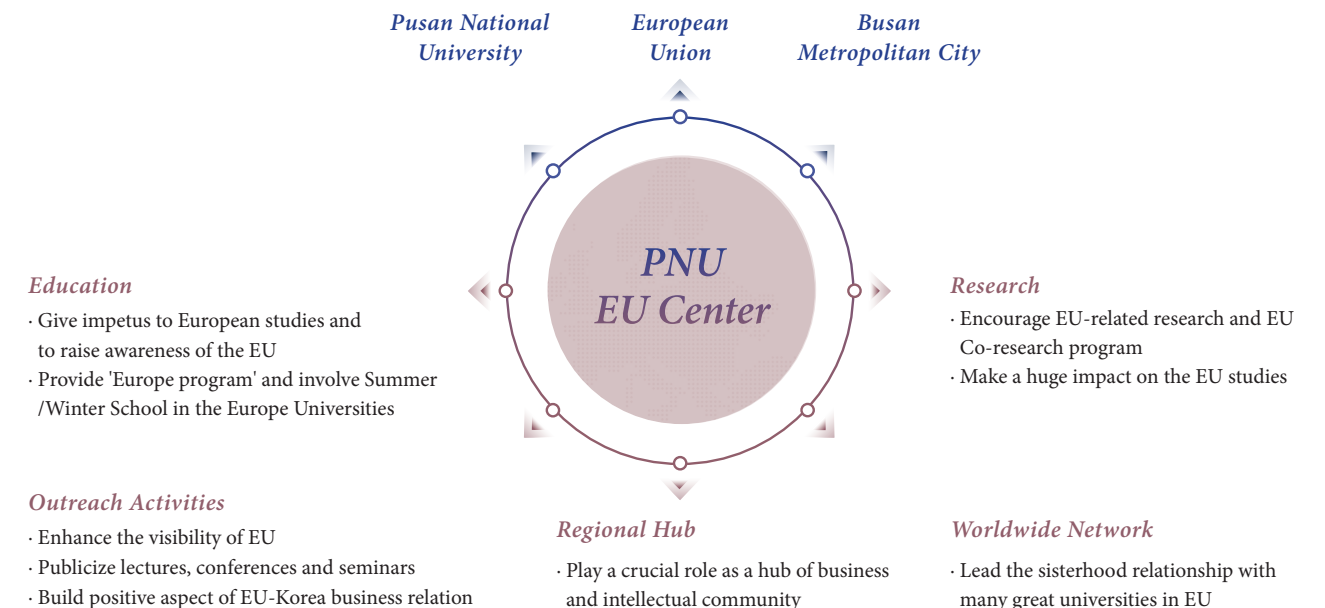

This is held once a year at one of universities joined as EU centers. The Netherlands, Country all the differences can be beautiful!

What do you think when you imagine Netherlands? Guus Hiddink? windmill? Dutch coffee? Maybe tulip could be more romantic answer. Actually It's still quite unfamiliar country for most Koreans. I can't say that I understand Netherlands perfectly. Two weeks experience was definitely too short. But It was enough time to feel the Dutch difference compared with Korea. Most of all, Dutch creativity was the most inspired thing to me. I was surprised that I could watch and feel the new things, which I had never experienced in Korea.

Especially, I was so surprised that this country allows many things considered as unethical issues in other countries. Dutch government allowed euthanasia, gay marriage, drug usage and prostitution more quickly than any other countries in the world. I thought that this excess of permission must cause many social problems. But there were few problems because of these permissions. It's interesting that these unethical issues work well and make added value within Netherlands. Not only these surprising permission, but also Dutch reclamation projects and foreign language policies were also impressive. Netherlands has very small territory. It's about 40% of South Korean territory. Dutch people decided to make their sea into new land. Furthermore, Government strongly encouraged people to study other language. The government enlarged Dutch people's sphere of action by forcing them to study other languages.

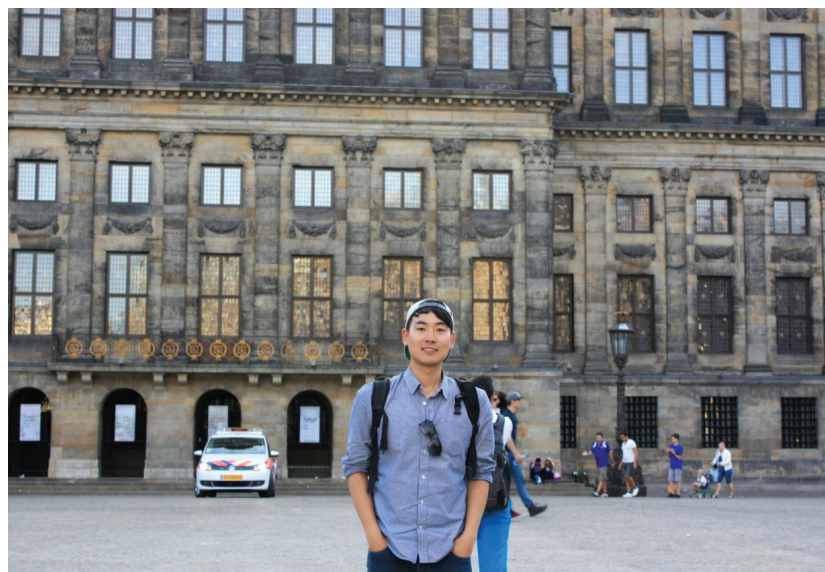
These things were special for me. I think all of these things are from Dutch people's flexibility and reasonable think. Their flexibility made them accept many differences, and use it for better results and changes. creativity is same. The reason why Netherlands is creative is that they can think flexibly and accept the difference rather than excluding others.

As a result of this, Netherlands is very specialized in global trade. Institutionally, It has very strong global education system served with English although its national language is not English.

Compared with Korea, Dutch attitude to accept the differences and adapting on the environment immediately seems to make more creative results and finally make more effective results.

The reason why Korea is less creative than Netherlands is probably because Korea always emphasizes unity of society and we are extremely unwilling to accept any differences. Individuality is traditionally not considered as a good value in Korean culture. It's because our way of life is essentially Confucian.

Small land, limited resources, decreasing population, powerful neighbor countries, high level of dependence on trade, Korea and Netherland seem to be so similar each other. But our way is too different. I suggest this is why we have to focus on Netherlands.



Hungary Corvinus Univ.

I was in Corvinus University of Budapest, Hungary. Corvinus University is the best university in Budapest. The facilities were clean and cool, especially the air conditioner worked really well during extremely hot summer days with almost 39 degrees Celsius.

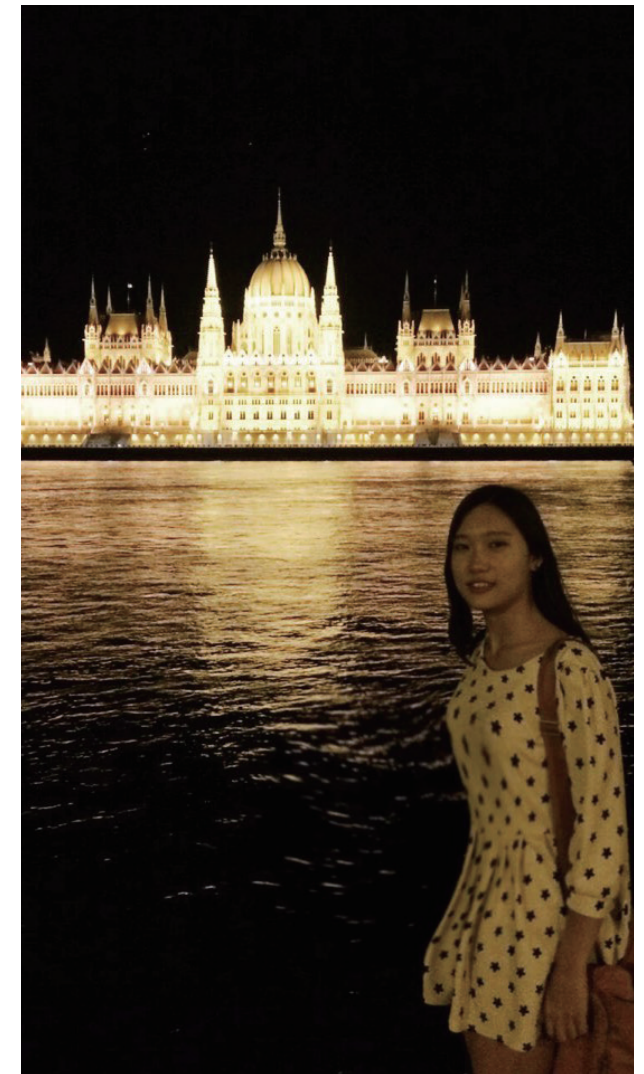
The lectures were from 9 to 11:30am, and the break time was about ten minutes. We studied Developmental Aid. The contents were why and how developed countries help developing ones, and the types of aid. The professors were two Hungarians, but the first professor who was male had a good command of British English because he studied in England. It was hard to listen to his explanations at first, but we gradually got used to and could understand them.

Let me explain one of the most impressive parts among what we studied. It is 'The Theory of Change', and the process of change has five stages. Inputs are money, knowledge, and personnel; Activities are what we do in order to transform inputs into outputs; Outcomes are the change in behavior of people due of the outputs; Impact is long run societal changes.

Contrary to my expectation, we were only Koreans and the students in each class were small in number. We had many opportunities to freely ask and discuss with one another because there were fewer than ten students. I was surprised and envious of foreign students' confidence to point out and ask questions actively to the professor. I definitely realized that they had different educational environment and mind from Korean one. There were the seminars, so we could fully understand and deeply learn the lectures by applying them to examples and suggesting our opinions.

My team composed of four members were all in the department which are far from economics. Therefore, it was difficult to understand the contents easily but cooperation largely helped us. We reviewed the lectures looking at the PPTs through our laptops after the classes. We studied pretty passionately asking each other what we could not understand. As a result, all of us could get good grades.

Also, we made a variety of friends there. We met characteristic friends from the Netherlands, Switzerland, Italy, Germany, China, and Iran. I thought there would be racial discrimination, but they



treated us alike without any prejudice. All of them played well and studied hard. I could learn many things from them.

It was the most memorable excursion to go to Széchenyi Bath. Since the only country accustomed to thermal spring culture was Korea, every foreign friend felt novelty in this. It was funny to see that they said 'hot!' in warm water. Also, it was their first time to be in a sauna, so they felt so interested and hot. Anyway, it was great time to be able to associate with everyone as a whole.

I was very happy to gain the valuable experience of studying and playing with friends from various countries. I really appreciate to EU center for giving me such unforgettable experiences.
